PetVac - Getting Started

Using the PetVac successfully may require a little planning. Whether your pet is confident or skittish, you can be sure your pet will become comfortable with PetVac by using the following tips. Begin slowly, have patience, and you and your pet will enjoy years of comfort and cleanliness.

IMPORTANT: Begin by grooming your pet with the vacuum turned off.
WARNING: Connect PetVac hose to existing hose - NOT inlet

Be sure your pet becomes accustomed to being groomed with the ShedEliminator before adding the sensation of suction to your grooming.

Some pets are relaxed and not disturbed by new sounds or sensations. You'll be able to use the grooming tool with the suction right away. Some pets, however, require a slow and steady start to a new routine. Take the time to be sure your pet first enjoys the sensation of the grooming tool and then the sensation of the suction during grooming.

It is normal for your pet to lose a lot of hair at the first use. The required duration and frequency of using ShedEliminator depends on the breed of your pet, time of year, and condition of its coat.

Connect the PetVac black vacuum hose to the end of your long central vacuum hose. Simply slide the black hose end with the metal ring over the longer hose handle's stub. Next, rotate the air bleeder cuff to let air into the hose. If you have a bleeder valve on your regular hose, open that one up too. The suction from the central vacuum is too powerful for grooming. Opening up the bleeder valves and having two hoses connected together diminish the suction to a workable flow.

Once your pet is comfortable with the grooming tools turn the suction on but do not connect the hose to the tool. Have the hose 10 feet away so the suction sound is present as you continue to groom. If truly sensitive to sound, try putting the hose ends, where the two hoses connect to each other, in a different room. The bleeder valves on them are louder than the hose end where you will connect the grooming tool.

When your pet is comfortable with the tool and the sound of air at the end of the black hose, connect the vacuum hose to the grooming tool and enjoy the cleanest grooming you've ever performed.

Find the right angle. Hold the grooming tool at an angle to keep the suction from gripping the coat. It will take some time to learn to "drive" your PetVac.

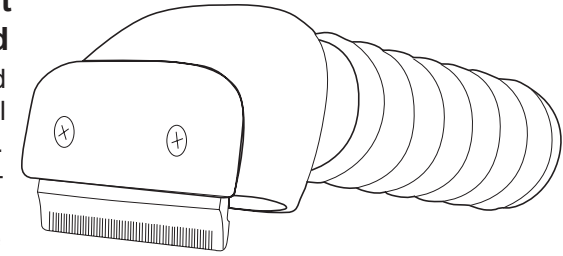
A note about cats. Cats are fastidious and will clean themselves and sometimes each other regularly. Loose hair can get caught in their digestive tract, causing blockage and suffering. You can lessen or avoid hairballs altogether, by helping your cat stay groomed with PetVac. Use PetVac "Getting Started" tips to get your cat accustomed to the sound and feel of being groomed with suction. Most cats enjoy the sensation of having excess fur – both the surface coat and the softer, finer undercoat – removed.

Once you set a PetVac grooming routine, stay with it. Like children, pets thrive on consistency. If you groom your pet daily or every few days, your pet will recognize the sound of PetVac and happily come to be groomed. It will become a special time for you and your pet.

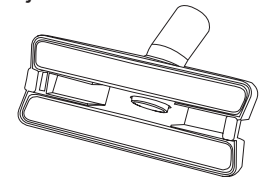

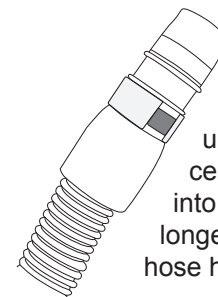
How does it work? The ShedEliminator does not cut the pet's hair or coat. It is designed to remove the loose undercoat with its safe and effective carding blade. Carding removes much more unwanted undercoat than the regular grooming process of bathing and brushing. The blade loosens and removes the undercoat before the pets get a chance to shed all over the house. Carding is advised to happen outdoors because of the mess, but that is limited by the weather and, again, the mess it can make in a yard or nearby pool. PetVac solves it all by adding suction from your existing vacuum. And yes, this grooming kit can be used with portable vacuums.



Small Grooming Tool. This original suction-partnered pet grooming tool has its place in the line up. Use it on the pet's paws, in between toes and pads, to remove hair and debris. Use it on the coat for a deep massage or finishing touch. The soft rubber is perfect for the job.



Lint & Hair Removal Brush. This brush is a must-have for furniture covered in pet fur, or for that jacket with hair and dander all over it.



Suction Hose with Bleeder Valve.

Designed specifically for the central vacuum owner, this unique 15-foot hose helps "bleed off" the extra power of the central vacuum, making grooming easy. Do not plug this hose into any wall inlets, it may whistle loudly. Connect it to your longer central vacuum hose only. If your existing central vacuum hose has a bleeder valve, open it as well.
